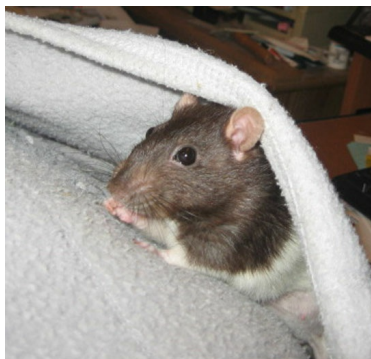

Foster Homes Needed

We have numerous rabbits who have been with us for way too long. We are looking for temporary foster homes for one or two (a bonded pair) of rabbits for at least one month. Fostering means providing daily one-on-one playtime, grooming and socializing to help these rabbits overcome their shyness and encourage their great personalities to shine. How are we funded?

We are able to continue our work of rescuing, spay/neuter and adopting rabbits, guinea pigs and rodents only because of your support. You support us by shopping at our Seattle store, since all proceeds go to care for our rescues. When you shop, you can increase your support by using cash or checks instead of credit or debit cards. Accepting cards cost us \$3,500 in 2011--that is a lot of spay/neuters. So if you have a choice, using cash/checks can add up to a lot of help.

When we place an animal in their new home, we ask for an adoption fee. The adoption fee does not cover the cost of the spay/neuters or of the food and maintenance we provide to the animals while they're in our care.

We board your rabbits, guinea pigs and rodents while you're on vacation. Although our rates are the lowest around, we do make money from our boarding fees.

We receive no government funding. Without your help, we would have to close our doors.

Move into new Shelter:
